As part of our team, you assist individuals who are also living with an injured brain to understand, define, and pursue their unique recovery journey. The Injured Brain Peer Supporters (IBPS) will meet with people living with an injured brain, introduce the Recovery Journey model to them, and invite and assist them to define their own Recovery Journey. The IBPS will then spend time supporting the Peer to pursue their Recovery Journey.
